Maths - This week focuses on revision of percentages

Learning Overview and Activities

Percentages

We are going to continue our work on percentages this week. The children will be revising their understanding of percentages and reviewing some of the things that they found a little tricky last week. By the end of the week, they will be able to use the bar model and other pictorial representations to solve problems involving percentages. The children will be able to represent percentages as fractions using the denominator 100 and make the connection to decimals and hundredths. They will also be able to recognise percentages, decimals and fractions are different ways of expressing proportions.

Activity 1

Watch the Maths Input Video and pause the video to complete this activity – or complete it in Purple Mash where it is set as Maths Activity 1 2Do

Activity 2

Watch the Maths Input Video, either pause the video or watch after, the BBC bitesize clip following the link on the right and do the associated activity

You can either complete Activity 2 in the video on paper or in Purple Mash where it is set as Maths Activity 2 as a 2Do

We have given you a few ideas for English this week – we would love everybody to complete 1 and 2, but we have also included a Pobble if you would like to do this to.

As this is a whole school project, we don't mind if you (and definitely encourage you to) complete it with your brothers or sisters if you want to.

Writing Activity 1

This week we would like you to complete a project about VE day.

You can choose to present your learning in any way that you wish and we would like you to spend a little bit of time each day working on your project. There are lots of really good resources available to support you in learning about VE day and we have included a few links on the right to get you started. We have also made a video for you to summarise some of the key facts.

You can use any publishing tools on Purple Mash to help you – 2Publish+ has lots of really good templates to use, 2Create a Story is a good app to make a more interesting presentation – or you could try your hand at creating an animation. You can also work on paper and ask your parents to send in your work. When you are creating your project, we want you to really think about how you present your work, especially your spelling and punctuation.

Sometimes it is a little hard to think of ideas, so we have also set a few 2Dos in Purple Mash to give you some ideas, or for you to complete instead.

Writing Activity 2

For this activity, we would like you to write a letter to Her Majesty The Queen to thank her for the contribution she made to the war effort and tell how you have been learning all about and celebrating VE day. We have set this as a task in Purple Mash, but if you want to write it and send us a picture that is great!

Learning Overview and Activities (Project focus)

Objectives:

- I am learning about significant historical events in my own locality.
- I understand how significant events/anniversaries are commemorated.


Choose any of the activities to complete. Please send us any pictures of what you do!

Activity 1

Ask your child to weigh/measure out the ingredients and then make a wartime recipe- an eggless sponge.

Put the tea, butter, sugar, sultanas in saucepan, heat gently for butter to melt and leave to cool. Mix all dry ingredients

together and add to cooled liquid. Give it a beat to mix well. Grease and line a 7" cake tin and pour in the mixture.



Cook at 180 degrees for about 45 minutes.

Leave to cool, take pictures then enjoy (or save for your party!)

½ pt tea (no milk), 3oz butter/marg, 3oz sugar, 3oz sultanas, 10oz wholewheat flour (with 3-4 tsp baking powder), 1 tsp allspice/mixed spice, extra cinnamon if wanted.

7" Cake tin, butter and greaseproof paper for lining the tin.

<p><u>Activity 2</u> After learning about VE Day, make a card for a soldier coming home from the war, and write a message inside. Ask your adults if you can have a 'party' with your family or with toys and pretend food. Make some bunting, flags and/or place mats to decorate your garden.</p>	<p>Paper/card, colouring pens/pencils, (We have set some 'make your own bunting' activities in Purple Mash too)</p>
<p><u>Activity 3</u> On VE Day 75 years ago, people in Britain danced and had parties to celebrate the end of the war in Europe. Have a VE day party with music and dancing, and sandwiches. Write a diary of your day once you have finished the party. Ask your adults to take lots of photos.</p>	<p>Wartime music, sandwiches (dripping sandwiches!), etc. Camera.</p>
<p><u>Activity 4</u> Why not make a replica spitfire. Or design a celebration 'VE day 75' mug</p>	<p>Paper (We have set a WWII aircraft activity in Purple Mash too)</p>
<p><u>Activity 5</u> As we celebrate VE day this week, we remember past generations that gave so much. However, we also remember their legacy, peace in the world. Write your own prayer asking for peace to honour those brave men and women that fought to seek this, both abroad and at home so many years ago.</p>	<p>Do this on purple mash, paper or simply say your prayer.</p>
