Use these links (one with/one without actions) to practice the months of the year, with actions.

How many months of the year are there?

Write out the months for your child, cut into strips, practice reading each one and then ask them to order them and glue in order.

(Ensure they focus on the initial sounds to help know what each word says).

Challenge: add a relevant weather picture to each month

If 100 is too much at this point, stop at 50, or where appropriate, and build throughout the 2 week period.

Within this link, practice the following sounds – oo/oo ar ai

Watch through first, and then turn off the sound and ask your child to 'Fred-talk' (sound out) each word and then blend each one.

Work through the different sounds during the week.

If confident on these sounds, feel free to explore some of the other ones.

Continue with these links...as appropriate and/or use the tricky words ppt.

Children need to be really secure with tricky words.

Activity 6

Paint /decorate a eggbox with bright colours - leave this to dry.
 Now collect 6 diff items/treasures - one for each segment of your treasure box. **Try to make them as many different materials as possible** (feather, stone, shell, sponge, key, plastic brick, wooden block, flower/ leaf).
 Make a list of your objects using your own phonic knowledge - I don't mind if the words aren't spelt quite right.
Challenge: Add an adjective to each object in your list to describe its texture (smooth, bumpy, rough, shiny, etc)
