As well as developing our art skills, we will also be making links to history, learning how studying art history can reveal information about the past, and exploring non-choronological report writing in our English through the learning journey.


This set of resources will cover the two sessions for project on the timetable for today – work through at your own pace. You could rearrange your learning and do all the activities in one go if you want to.

- What do we wonder/what questions do we have?






Click on the picture on the left to visit the British Museum via Google Street View



Go on a virtual tour of the British Museum using the links above. What can you find out about Ancient Greek art and sculpture?






Click on the each of the pictures to the left and right to visit DK Find Out and the BBC Website.
