


Imagine you are in the rocket in the story and you are going to a new planet – what might it look like?


















Imagine you are looking out of the rocket window – draw what you might see as you look down at the planet.

You decide to land on the planet and go and explore.


You decide that you want to settle on the planet and make it your home

What animals and plants are there?

There are many similarities between the two stories. We have read the story of Romeo and Juliet in class – but in case you cannot remember there is a modern animated adaptation in this link:



Task 2 - Tigers Class



Your task is to write a report which explains the similarities and differences between The Smeds and The Smoos and Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet.

You will find it helpful to make a list of things that are the same (themes/characters/plot) and things that are different.

What do you think is the message behind the stories – are they the same?

In your report, it would be a good idea to use sub-headings to structure your writing.

Think about how you are going to introduce your report topic. What headings might you include? How will you summarise your report in your concluding paragraph? You might want to research some aspects. I have included my overview for a report below to help you.

Report Title: Comparison of The Smeds and The Smoos and Romeo and Juliet

Introductory paragraph — explaining what you are going to do in the report (compare the two stories)/ introduce the stories and who they are written by

Headings: Summary of The Smeds and The Smoos
Summary of Romeo and Juliet
Similarities between the two stories
Differences between the two stories

Concluding paragraph – Sum up what you have found out.
