He wrote lots of books that rhymed!



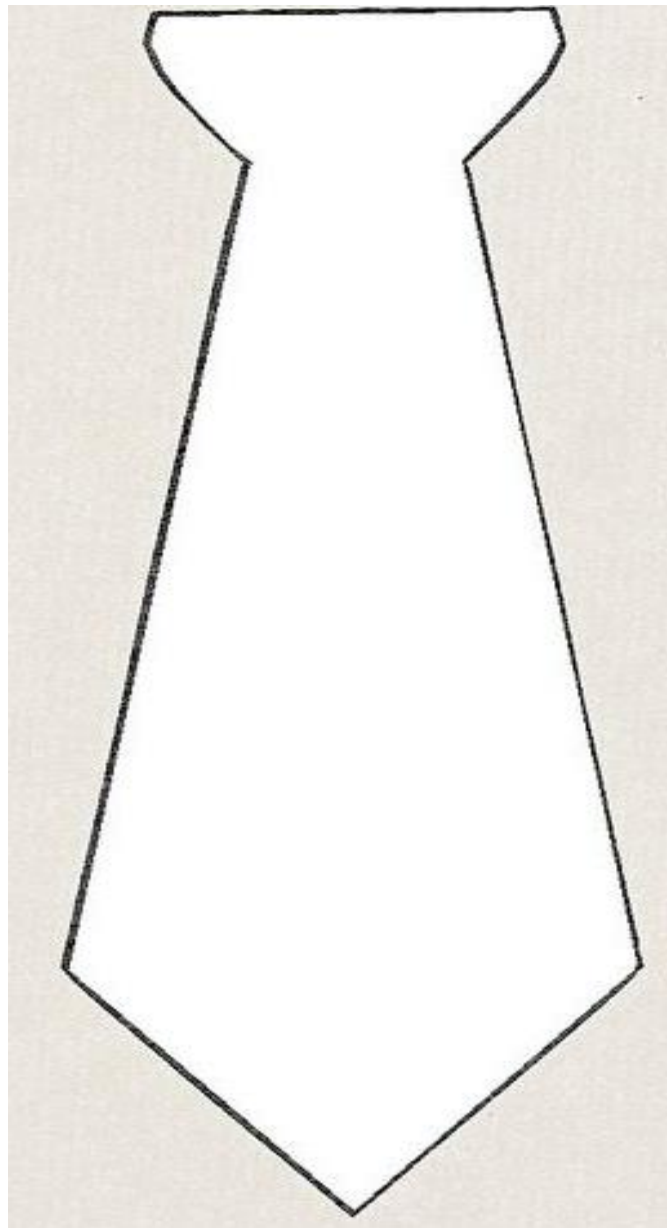
