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Find out about Viking Longboats, then draw and design your own to fit what you have learned. You could draw, paint or even make a model version.

Viking built longships for war and raiding. These ships were sometimes known as '**dragonships**'.

They were long and narrow so that they could travel quickly through the water. This was important for surprise attacks and quick getaways. The ships were powered by wind in a wool sail, or by the manpower of rowing with oars if there wasn't any wind available.

A **figurehead** at the front of the ship helped to scare enemies! Very detailed carvings were etched into the sides of the ship. Viking shields were tied over the oar hole to protect Viking men and women during battles. The sail was square and sometimes dyed red, again to scare the enemies away!



Challenge: Don't forget to design your own scary figurehead. You could draw this separately to show the detail and gain additional house points, and what fun this will be for you.
